The sheds are now back in full swing for 2023 and it's great to see so much activity with the men all enthused and getting stuck into new projects for the year.

I had the pleasure of visiting Endeavour Hills last week, which is a shed I have watched develop over the past few years. From humble beginnings operating out of a Kindergarten building that was shared with other groups, with the guys having to pack up all their tools at the end of everyday with only 14 members; to their current new shed that includes not only a large purpose-built workshop, but professional meeting rooms, a fully fitted kitchen, and a dedicated purpose-built office space it's an amazing success story. They now have 84 members with new members lining up to join which proves if you build it and run a good operation, they will come. The guys did a lot of lobbying over the years with both council, government departments and their local politicians, and there were many challenges along the way. Ultimately, they lobbied hard at every opportunity to anyone that would listen and got a great outcome proving hard work pays off, and now have a thriving shed and a great success story.

I also attended the Gippsland "Heads of Sheds" meeting that was held at the Leongatha Men's Shed and credit to ex VMSA Board member Barbara Look for organizing a very successful and productive event with 17 sheds and around 50 people in attendance actively networking and sharing ideas, learnings and information on what's going on in the region. I can't stress enough how important these type of meetings are for sheds, and I strongly encourage all sheds to get involved in cluster meetings, heads of sheds meetings, and other type of gatherings that get sheds together sharing their knowledge. Supporting these events will be a focus for VMSA this year and I welcome you to contact the VMSA office and staff if you need assistance in getting these off the ground.

Korumburra-On the Move

Korumburra's New Shed

Korumburra Men's Shed has operated for 14 years, initially in a small building ("The Joinery") at the Coal Creek Community Park and Museum on the outskirts of Korumburra. We started by renovating an almost derelict building within the park and it became our home for about five years. We quickly outgrew The Joinery and several years later, an enquiry from the South Gippsland Tourist Railway regarding help with the restoration of some railway carriages led to an offer to move into "The Goods Shed" on the Korumburra Station which we happily accepted as it was over double the size of The Joinery.

We then set about turning the bare tin shed into our new home. Unfortunately, within six months of us taking over the building, the South Gippsland Tourist Railway closed down and we had to apply for a lease on the shed direct from VicTrack who owned the station site. However, before that lease could be finalised, our Shire Council started negotiating with VicTack for a lease over the station site for use as a community hub and they indicated that we would probably have to move.

So we approached VicTrack and asked about a large tin shed on the corner of Bridge and Station Streets in Korumburra which the Shire were not interested in. VicTrack told us to apply for the lease which was subsequently approved and serious negotiations started. The shed was the old locomotive shed and the floor was gravel and railway tracks with inspection pits between some of the tracks but VicTrack were only prepared to fill the pits and level the gravel and lease the shed "as is". We had applied for and received the DFFH 2022 Men's Shed Grant but this would not allow us completely fit out the shed so we were faced with the prospect of a meeting room/kitchen and toilet with a concrete floor but a workshop with a gravel floor.

So we approached our local member – Danny O'Brien – who then approached the Minister for Transport who agreed that leasing a shed with a gravel floor for the purposes of a Men's Shed was not on and agreed to fund the concrete floor.

The concrete floor was poured in two sections during February and the shed is now ready to be fitted out. We have started moving things into the shed and fitting out will start in the next few weeks.

The floor area of the new shed is nearly eight times larger than the existing shed so we believe that this will be our forever home. It will have a dedicated parking area compared with the public carpark we currently next to and security fencing around it. Internally, the workshop will be much larger and the natural lighting will be better with many clear roof panels. The meeting room and kitchen will be much larger and we will have our own toilet facilities on site rather than having to use public toilets a short distance from the shed.

We have been restricted in what we can do in our existing shed because of the space limitations so we are anticipating being able to do much more in the workshop, we will be building a computer room and be able to have functions in our meeting room. We have never actively recruited members for our shed as our buildings have always been at capacity very shortly after moving into them but we plan to start recruiting soon.

NSDP Grants

National Shed Development Programme (NSDP)

The NSDP makes sure that all men's sheds in Australia have access to a wide range of resources and support for their particular shed.

The NSDP is a competitive men's shed grants program that started in 2010. It allows men's sheds and the organisations that support them to apply for funds. They then use these funds to better respond to their community's needs.

A men's shed is a community-based organisation that is open to all men. Men can gather and work on meaningful projects at their own pace and in their own time.

The aim of men's sheds is to improve the health and wellbeing of its members.

Why it is important

The NSDP allows men's sheds to apply for grant funds to: help with health promotion activities purchase equipment maintain their buildings.

A men's shed is a community-based organisation that is open to all men. Men can The NSDP conducts 2 rounds each year (\$500,000 for each round). Funding is not automatically guaranteed. Sheds must apply for funding and all requests are evaluated all requests based on appropriateness and need.

Flood Assistance Grant

Helping Flood-Affected Communities Reconnect

The Andrews Labor Government is helping Neighbourhood Houses and Men's Sheds in floodaffected communities repair damage caused by the devastating events of last October and November.

Minister for Disability, Ageing and Carers Lizzie Blandthorn today announced applications for the next round of the \$500,000 Rebuild and Reconnect grant program are now open.

The grants will help the Neighbourhood Houses and Men's Sheds – central players in their communities – continue to bring local people together to participate in recreational activities and deliver essential services.

During emergencies, Neighbourhood Houses provide critical support to communities through services including food relief. Men's Sheds support a range of community projects and local services, including the State Emergency Service and Country Fire Authority.

Five much-loved organisations received grants totaling \$142,000 from the first round of the program. They include:

- Mooroopna Education and Activity Centre for repairs and replacement of furniture and equipment.
- Rochester Community House for internal refurbishment to the building and equipment replacement for the house and Men's Shed.
- Echuca Neighbourhood House for replacement of furniture and equipment.
- Charlton Neighbourhood House for rectification of damage to doors, floors and walls and furniture replacement.
- Benalla Woodworkers Association and Men's Shed for repair of electric motors for dust extractors.

South Gippsland Citizen of the Year

If you're looking for a helping hand,

Max is your man!

Originally a dairy farmer in Welshpool, Max Wood can remember making cement bricks for the hall, pouring wheelbarrow loads of concrete for the Welshpool tennis courts, and putting hundreds of nails into the floor of the basketball stadium in Welshpool.

Raising five daughters with his late wife Rosemary didn't stop Max from being involved in various committees including the Welshpool Hall, Welshpool Tennis Club, Port Welshpool Museum, and Welshpool Golf Club. His life in Welshpool was heavily rooted in volunteerism, like with the Welshpool CFA where he spent 39 years and as a boundary umpire, and later goal umpire for the Welshpool Football Club.

In 1989, Max and Rosemary retired from dairy farming and moved into Leongatha where Max quickly became involved in the community by joining the Woorayl Golf Club Committee, South Gippsland Golf Classic Committee and the Leongatha Men's Shed where he is currently the President.

Max helped establish the Leongatha Men's Shed in 2012. Men's sheds have been and continue to be a great place for men to come together to have meaningful conversations, all while they share skills, enjoy activities, and a sneaky cuppa or two. Connection is important in organisations like this and the work they do for the community through their woodworking and other skills is phenomenal. Many of us have been the recipient of something created in a Men's Shed.

Max was front-and-centre helping to raise funds for the new Leongatha Men's Shed that was opened earlier this year. The members worked hard to raise \$400,000 by selling their own products, having sausage sizzles, obtaining grants from Council and the State Government, as well as seeking donations from local businesses. 72 per cent of the cost of the new facilities was raised by the Men's Shed themselves.

Max's most recent achievements are made more spectacular by his limited mobility and loss of an eye during a car accident seven years ago that sadly took his wife of 52 years. After two months in hospital and rehabilitation, Max returned to his community – his men's Shed and the Woorayl Golf Club. He is well loved and described as an inspiration.
